The Monuments Men Premieres February 7, 2014!




Matt Damon and George Clooney on the set of The Monument Men. (Photo courtesy of Sony Pictures.)

The countdown begins! The story of the men and women, who helped preserve so much of our cultural heritage from the destruction of war and theft by the Nazis, will soon appear on movie screens around the world beginning in the United States on February 7, 2014. The film, directed by and starring George Clooney, includes a stellar cast of the world's most accomplished actors including: Matt Damon, Cate Blanchett, John Goodman, Bill Murray, Jean Dujardin and Hugh Bonneville.

Robert visited the set on three occasions and noted the extraordinary degree of passion each actor had for their respective character and the overall story. Filmed entirely on location in Europe and England, The Monuments Men tells the story of a small group of men and women – the most unlikely of spies – who are in a race against time to locate and save some of civilization's most beautiful and important masterpieces from destruction by Nazi fanatics in the final days of the war.

It is a gripping story of heroism and adventure involving one of the great events of modern time! In addition to the existing hardcover, Little, Brown has just released a special movie tie-in paperback edition of *The Monuments Men*, available now online and at retail outlets across the country.


Laurel Publishing Releases a New Book - Rose Valland: Resistance at the Museum

The New York Times Bestseller: Saving Italy

The successful launch of *Saving Italy* began with a note of distinction: it debuted on The *New York Times* Bestseller list as the 13th highest rated non-fiction book. Over the course of four weeks, Robert made 14 appearances in 11 cities beginning in Kansas City and ending at The Getty Museum in Los Angeles, where he addressed a sold-out audience of more than 500 people. Many friends of the Monuments Men attended including those closest to the two leading figures in the book, Gene Markowski, longtime companion of Lt. Fred Hartt, and Bill Keller, son of Capt. Deane Keller.

Saving Italy tells the story of the work of these heroes of civilization beginning with the Allied invasion of Sicily and follows the Monuments officers as they work their way up the Italian peninsula, through Naples, Rome, Florence, and on towards Milan. With the German army retreating up the Italian peninsula, orders came from the highest levels of the Nazi government to transport truckloads of art north across the border into the Reich. Standing in the way was General Karl Wolff, a top-level Nazi officer. As German forces blew up the magnificent bridges of Florence, General Wolff commandeered the great collections of the Uffizi Gallery and Pitti Palace, later risking his life to negotiate a secret Nazi surrender with American spymaster Allen Dulles.

Going Home: Monuments Men Foundation Returns Missing 500 Year Old Books

In the early 1940s, the University of Naples Library, like museums across Italy, evacuated its collections from the city. About 14,000 volumes – a small quantity of the best items – were sent to the Church and Convent of San Francesco in Minturno, halfway between Naples and Rome.

The 339th Field Artillery Battalion, part of the 88th Infantry Division, United States Army, discovered this repository in late April 1944. The friars, who had been watching over the books in their convent, had fled when the building was hit by shells and the roof collapsed, leaving the books unattended. A news report from April 30, 1944 stated that "In a battered edifice with gaping holes in the roof were 170 separate boxes of priceless books of all ages, undamaged" and worth millions of dollars. Irving Tross, an army radio operator with the 339th Field Artillery Battalion, picked up eight of these books as a souvenir and had them in his possession since.

Recently, Mr. Tross's daughter, Ellene Shapiro, contacted the Monuments Men Foundation expressing her father's desire to return the eight books to Italy. While Mr. Tross did not know the history of the Minturno repository, he did recall that the crates had been marked "University of Naples." After examining the books and their various library stamps, and contacting the University, the Foundation determined that the books Mr. Tross possessed were in fact part of the Library's collection.

The Foundation then contacted the Italian Embassy in Washington, D.C. to initiate the return of the books. On May 9, 2013 the Tross family officially transferred custody of the books to the Monuments Men Foundation at a ceremony at the Pritzker Military Library in Chicago. Italian Consul General Hon. Adriano Monti attended the event and made remarks on behalf of the Italian Government. Irving Tross, his wife Shirley, daughter Ellene Shapiro, grandson Joshua Shapiro, son Nathan Tross, his wife Beth and their son Brian also attended.

On May 29, 2013, the Foundation formally returned the books at a ceremony held at the Italian Embassy in Washington, D.C. Italy's ambassador to the United States, the Honorable Claudio Bisogniero, and First Counselor Cristiano Maggipinto, welcomed Foundation President Robert M. Edsel and other special guests, including Joshua Shapiro representing the Tross family, to the press conference and signing ceremony that followed. Ambassador Bisogniero later hosted a luncheon at his residence as a way of expressing thanks to the Foundation and the Tross family. The Italian government will now transfer the books back to Italy, where they will once again be a part of the University of Naples Library collection.




Alfred C. Glassell, III, Trustee

The "Monuments Men," were a group of approximately 345 men and women from thirteen nations, most of whom volunteered for service in the newly-created Monuments, Fine Arts, and Archives (MFAA) section during World War II. Many had expertise as museum directors, curators, art historians, artists, architects, and educators. Only their job description seemed simple: to protect cultural treasures so far as war allowed.

The Monuments Men Foundation honors the legacy of the men and women who served in the MFAA section and their unprecedented and heroic work protecting and safeguarding civilization's most important artistic and cultural treasures from armed conflict during World War II.

The Foundation is completing the work of the Monuments Men by illuminating the path home for some of the hundreds of thousands of works of art still missing. It also works to use the legacy of these heroes of civilization to reestablish the gold standard for the protection of cultural treasures during conflict set by the Monuments Men. 




